The last time I was back in the U.P. with Bri and the girls was for my grandma Nancy's funeral last March. While we were there, my family went for lunch at the Irish Pub in town. The place was nearly empty. Shortly after we ordered, a young man and his girlfriend (I assumed) came walking in. He looked really familiar. Apparently I looked familiar to him too, because he came over to shake my hand and say "hello".

I hate it when that happens - someone remembers me but I don't remember them. However, it was my home town. This guy could have been a high school friend's kid brother or something. So I asked him to remind of his name. It was no help, I still couldn't place him. Finally from the context of the conversation - and him referring to my dad as his uncle, I finally figured out it was my cousin Kyle. I, obviously, hadn't seen him in a long time. The last time I had seen him he was still playing high school football. It felt awkward. I felt terrible. But he was very gracious, and we had a nice conversation.

I could have simply pretended to know who he was - kept things general and not bothered to get his name. I'm glad that I didn't, because not only did I get a good story, but I got to connect with another family member I hadn't seen in years.

I have had some similar conversations with some of you. Not about me being unable to remember a name (though it happens) but because sometimes, at church, it's hard to tell who the visitors are.

Over the last 30 or 40 years, regular church attendance has gone from being 3-4 times a month to only once or twice a month. And so it is possible for people to be attending the same church together for years and not have met each other, even in a congregation like Trinity.

The conversations I have had with folks have been about being scared to approach someone they think might be visiting, because they might have been attending here for years without crossing paths. That interaction could be awkward and uncomfortable. I totally get that.

I want to try to take away that discomfort a bit simply by naming it as a reality of our life together as a church. You are going to see people that you think are new, and you are going to approach them to welcome them - and they are going to want to welcome you because they think you are new. I want to encourage you, in moments like that, to laugh about it and say, "Pastor Mike said that might happen." It is far better to err on the side of hospitality than to avoid people over the possibility of awkwardness.

So take a risk. Say "hello", introduce yourself to someone you don't know at church this week. It might be the start of a new friendship, or it could be my cousin Kyle.


FAT TUESDAY JAZZ & EATS TUESDAY, FEB. 13-6:00PM

COMMUNITY MINISTRIES



THE MINISTRY OF TIME...

Starting a new year in January your mind races to what's next. This year, my mind has really gone to the simple fact of time as ministry. In my time here at Trinity I've been blessed to make some amazing memories and meet phenomenal people who I've come to regard as true friends. Some are wonderful supporters of the Community Ministries Program and are thankful for the work we do at Trinity. I've come to really appreciate the conversations with those people and that investment of the time getting to know them and their story. It truly means a lot to me.

Throughout our school year, Kids C lub and Transitions Program volunteers and the families spend a lot of time with each other. These hours spent together build a unique bond and both volunteers from inside the church and outside share a special bond. THAT time spent is ministry, and there is nothing quite like it. It's a true intergenerational ministry that has individuals of all ages joining together. What most churches aspire to do with intergenerational ministry, we are doing now each week from October through April.

You can never go wrong investing in people- investing in relationships that help shape us and deepen our faith.





Another wonderful example of this is a new ministry that gets people from the full spectrum of ages from both inside the church and people from the community. They have been meeting here at the church once a month for over a year, have left the building and gone on adventures together, have brought in experts to teach them about topics of interest, and have provided fathers and sons time to spend together with activities to do together they didn't previously have. Grandparents have also been able to spend time with grandsons sharing opportunities they have never previously had! This group has continued to grow through word of mouth and members can be found talking about Trinity and this program to people in the community who have been intrigued by it as well. This group isn't just for fathers, sons, and grandpas. Upon hearing about this program from an article that was promoted around the state of Michigan, we had three

women pastors from other UMC churches join and have a blast. They will be continuing to meet once a month through the spring all while sharing this important time together. Finally, some of our younger members of the group have had an opportunity to have unique "firsts" that could possibly be one of those defining moments of their youth with even pictures to commemorate the moment!

What is this great ministry? You probably guessed it! Faith on the Fly! The unique thing about this program is that its creating opportunities to spend time together, to be engaged in ministry that matters. Talk to a dad in our program, or a grandpa or anyone- it's been a fun adventure! Fishing is just the thing we do, but the people spending time together- that's the good stuff. That's the intergenerational ministry churches all want, that's what they read books about "how to," but it's already happening here.

That's why I get excited about ministry. It's about spending time together, building relationships and growing in your faith. So remember, it's not about the fishing, but instead about the ministry of time!

MISSIONS IMPACT UPDATE

UNITED CHRISTIAN CAMPUS FELLOWSHIP

\$1,000 was given to <u>United Christian Campus Fellowship's</u> program to address food insecurity of students at GVSU, GRCC, and Ferris State through this collaborative effort of the UMC, ELCA, PCUSA, and the Episcopal Church.



THANKSGIVING FOOD INGATHERING

\$300 and 35 bags of food were given for our Thanksgiving Food Ingathering for the food pantries of South End Community Ministries (SECOM), North End Community Ministry (NECM), and the Al-Tawheed Islamic Center.

READERS TO LEADERS FOR CHILDREN IN LIBERIA AND MICHIGAN

\$561 from members who earmarked for Missions in their stewardship giving was given to the Michigan Conference's Readers to Leaders scholarship program in Liberia and Freedom Schools in Detroit and Flint.

GROWING THE UMC IN CAMEROON

The UMC in Cameroon is working toward the goal of becoming a Provisional Conference by 2027. To support required church growth the following has been given \$625 for <u>United Women in Faith Cameroon</u> to empower rural women in the conflict zone of the South West and North West Region; \$625 for the <u>Ebenezer Community Church</u> building project in Younde Cameroon; and \$250 to seed new members in the cities of Tiko, Mbalmayo, and Tombel.

GUEST PREACHER & HAM DINNER SUNDAY, MARCH 3


