Hello Friends.

A long time ago in a town far, far away I got hired as a youth pastor. It was my first staffed position in this denomination. It was my first time even attending a United Methodist Church where the pastor was not my partner or my father-in-law. About six months into my time there when it was time for our Church Conference, I noticed something odd.

One of the things we do at our annual Church Conference is elect leaders onto various committees and teams within the church. Nominees had been approached and accepted those nominations in advance. So at the conference all we had to do was vote on a slate of leaders for the church. The odd thing was, when I got to the conference and read the leadership roster that was up for vote, I saw my name on several committees that didn't relate to my area of ministry. No one had asked me, and I had no idea how my name got there.

I thought I'd lost my mind. I don't usually forget conversations, especially conversations like that. I didn't think that was the case, so before the conference started I asked the pastor how my name ended up in those slots, hoping the pastor would be as shocked as I was. They weren't. The pastor told me that they had put me on those committees so that the District Superintendent would see how well things are going because all the committee positions were filled.

There was no real expectation of me serving on those committees. It was a lie that pastor was telling to make himself look good. It left a very sour taste in my mouth. The only way I was able to get rid of that sour taste was to actually show up and serve on those committees. I did it to turn that pastor's lie into truth.

The part that bothered me most was, if asked, I would have said "yes", at least for a couple of the committees. Because I know the work committees do is important. It's not simply about having spots on the roster filled. The work our committees do is about embodying the heart and soul of our congregation. It's about ensuring that every voice is heard, and that every direction we take is guided by the collective wisdom and aspirations of our community. Our community thrives when its leadership reflects the diversity, creativity, and passion of its people.

In the next couple of weeks I am going to provide you with the opportunity to sign up for whichever leadership team at Trinity peaks your interest. The goal is to allow you to express which areas of leadership interest you, so that the ministry you do in that context will be ministry that fulfills you. Those areas include the Vision and Leadership Board, Staff Parish Relations, Finance, Congregational Care, Missions/Outreach, Worship, Trustees, Discipleship, Hospitality, Church & Society, Historian, and Music. When the sign-up goes live there will be brief descriptions of each team.

A couple of things to note about the sign-up and serving. First, putting your name on that sign-up sheet doesn't immediately put you on that team. It just lets us know you would be interested in serving there if asked. Second, if you are asked to join a certain leadership team and it turns out to be a burden for you instead of a joy, all you have to do is let me know and we can find you another place to serve or give you some time to rest before joining another team. No judgement. Third, towards the end of every year the teams will take some time to prayerfully discern whether or not to continue in that capacity or to serve in another area. (continued)

This is vitally important for the future of Trinity. Without people on these teams helping to plan and care for the ministry of the church, Trinity will have great difficulty living into it's full potential. We all have gifts we have been given to use. When we use those gifts in service to others, we make God's love visible in the world, and find the peace and joy that comes with seeing our gifts and labor make a difference.

So as April begins, I ask you to take some time and prayerfully consider where it is in Trinity's leadership you are called to serve. If you come up with it before the sign-up sheets come out, just let me know. Write it on the back of a connection card and together we can find the ministry you are called to at Trinity.

POPCORN PARTY TIME FRIDAY, APRIL 12- 6:30PM-8:30PM






