### **Behind the Worship: Rituals and Relevance**

### **Beginning Again**

"The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness." - Lamentations 3:22–23

For as long as I can remember, I've loved new notebooks. If you're ever in a bookstore with me, and you lose sight of me, all you need to do is find where the journals and notebooks are and you will find me there. With the journals, running my hand across the covers and opening them to that very first page. For some reason, a new notebook has always felt like a fresh start. Those blank pages hold so much possibility.

September can feel like that in the church. The choir returns to the loft, small groups ramp up, kids shuffle back into classrooms with their own fresh notebooks, and together we begin writing a new chapter of our life as a congregation. God hands us a clean page and says, "Let's begin again."

Of course, notebooks don't stay blank for long. Some get filled quickly with ideas and lists. Some end up half-used. Some get messy, with handwriting so hurried you can't read it back later. Our lives are no different. We start with excitement, but soon the margins fill with scribbles, the lines with mistakes, and the covers with the wear and tear of everyday use. If our worth depended on keeping every page pristine, we'd all be in trouble.

That's why the promise of Lamentations matters so deeply. God doesn't wait until the notebook is perfect. God's mercies show up every single morning. They don't run out after we've made too many mistakes. They don't dry up when we've wasted opportunities or left pages blank. God's mercy meets us exactly where we are, in the scribbles, the cross-outs, the coffee stains, and the dogeared corners, and offers us a brand-new page each day.

So let me ask: what page do you need God to give you this September? Is it the page of forgiveness, where you release guilt that's been hanging around too long? Is it the page of courage, where you risk showing up to a new group or ministry? Is it the page of hope, where you dare to believe God is not finished with you yet? Is it the page of rest, where you allow God to remind you that you are loved just as you are?



Here's the good news: you don't have to write in isolation. The Spirit is already with you, guiding your hand, steadying your lines, and filling in the words you can't always find. And we write together as God's beloved community. Each class, each song, each table conversation, each prayer offered in worship is a sentence in the larger story God is telling through us.

That is Autumn's gift. We are reminded that we don't have to be perfect students or flawless writers. What matters is the author who never gives up on the story. God's mercies are new every morning, the pages never run out, and the story isn't finished yet. So let's take up the pen together and trust that the God who is faithful will keep writing grace into every chapter of our lives.

Did you know Trinity has its very own library that's free for everyone to use?







# Community Ministries

### 5 Ways To Put Your Faith Into Action This Fall...

The Community Ministries Program is always working to find new ways to connect people through a shared purpose. Whether its children's weekly programming, fly fishing classes, volunteer opportunities or learning opportunities around important topics we strive to bring unique experiences that allows church members to not only connect with the community but also to put your faith into action that takes us outside of just a Sunday morning. So here are 5 ways to engage with the Community Ministries Program this fall that will allow you to flex your "Faith In Action" muscles this fall.

- 1. Engage in classes or conversations outside of just Sunday morning that allows you to meet new people and learn something new about you or your faith. (CM Opportunity...Faith on the Fly classes begin in January, attend a "My Life In Pieces" event, connect with volunteers in the CM Program about their experiences working with kids from Congress)
- 2. Volunteer with the different opportunities that come up through the year with the Community Ministries Program (CM Opportunity...volunteer with the weekly Wednesday evening Kids Club or Transitions Program, Volunteer at Congress Elementary School for special events as needs come up, help at community festivals and events)
- 3. Financially support the Community Ministries Program and help make community connections (CM Opportunity...give a meaningful amount to you and help advocate that others support the ministry too. Help make community connections with businesses or private foundations to whom you might have connections to help make larger donations on a yearly basis that the program can build from)
- 4. Celebrate and be inspired by the work being done (CM Opportunity...attend "A Night To Remember" Dinner on Nov 7th to come hear stories from people who work with the Community Ministries program and Trinity UMC and feel the impact this work has on our community. The event is free, but registration is needed for food and set up. Registration begins on Sept 1st. Email <a href="mailto:m.witkowski@grtumc.org">m.witkowski@grtumc.org</a> to register with the guest's name, phone number and number of people attending in the registration. Registration will also be available in the Trinity Parlor.
- 5. Make a commitment to stay informed and share CM Program news with others both inside the church and out. (CM Opportunity....Like our Facebook Page, read the monthly newsletter, check in on Wednesday nights on Facebook to see what the kids were up to that evening, check the bulletin boards, like the Faith on the Fly Facebook or Instagram page and tell others what you see.)

These are just a few ways that you can start to put intentional actions to your faith journey that means the world to a program like ours. We want to grow but the only way that can happen is if we know what is happening in our church programming, get excited about it and share it with others. Will you help us? Find One...Two...or Five ways, like those listed above to help show your faith through action in our community through the local church. Lets get started today!
