*- Psalm 136:1*


It seems to me that November is the month when the year starts to feel its age. The air grows cooler, the daylight shorter, and the trees give up their leaves without much complaint. They say it's just part of getting older. The earth slows its hurried rhythm. The year, worn but wise, looks back with gratitude for all it has experienced. Joy and sorrow. Surprise and defeat. Stifling heat and bone-numbing cold.

Every year we see the cycle of new birth in spring and everything laid to rest in winter. All of creation reminds us that life is precious and holy because it isn't permanent. That's why it is fitting to begin November with a celebration of All Saints Sunday. A day of reflection on those who have shaped our lives, strengthened our faith, and finished their time and gone ahead to wait for us. We remember the laughter, the lessons, and the love that continue to echo through this church and through us. In their memory, we are reminded that every life leaves an imprint of grace.

This fall I presided over the memorial of a dear friend gone too soon, and just last week my family laid to rest the last set of great-grandparents my kids had. While my grief over the loss of such wonderful people is profound, I also find myself deeply grateful that I was blessed to have them in my life at all.

Our gratitude deepens when we take time to notice what has been good. Not perfect, but good. Not easy, but worth it. Nothing is ever perfect, and easy is how we make macaroni and cheese, not how we live a life worth remembering. The days behind us hold both joy and heartache, and yet God's faithfulness has carried us through every bit of it. Gratitude is one of the most honest acts of faith. It doesn't require everything to be right. It simply asks us to pay attention, to name the good, the grace, and the people who remind us we're not alone.

This month gives us a chance to do that together. On Sunday, November 23, we'll share our annual Thanksgiving Dinner after worship. It's a simple meal with deep meaning, a reminder that faith is not only built in the sanctuary but also around the table. It's in the laughter, the conversations, the passing of plates, and the presence of community.



After dinner, we'll move into the Hanging of the Greens as we prepare our sanctuary for Advent. The wreaths, candles, garlands, and lights we hang are more than decoration. They are symbols of readiness, our way of saying that we believe hope still comes, light still shines, and love still finds a way to be born among us.

As the year continues to feel its age, we are reminded that every ending carries the promise of a beginning. The slowing of one season prepares the ground for the next. Reflection gives birth to renewal. Gratitude turns our attention forward. Hope begins to stir quietly beneath the surface, waiting for its moment to rise.

The UM Community House is in a growing phase this year. The newly renovated Sunrise Bakery Building at 900 S. Division was opened in mid-August for congregate dining, wellness classes, clubs, classes of interest or with speakers, library, and social events, all for older adults. Soon dance class, including line dancing will start. A favorite exercise group is seated YOGA. UMCH has busses for transportation and trips. The Fresh Market helps people using the local city bus to have access to a food market.

The baby and child care areas will now be filling the 904 Sheldon Street building.

The baby and toddler classes will be able to help more families, as well as the pre-school classes. A helpful childcare need has been helping parents who work second shift have childcare service.

The school age programs continue at nine nearby schools in the afternoon. Also summer camp programs will continue. Our Thanksgiving offering will support programming as needed. You can see your gifts will help in many ways, as the UM Community House grows in use by many people of all ages.
