Behind the Worship: Rituals and Relevance

This time of year always brings a certain kind of energy to our life together. We felt it last week in a big way. To our normal rhythm of worship, we added the orchestra. After worship, we shared an incredible Thanksgiving feast. And after that meal, many of you stayed late to deck the halls for the season ahead. It was a phenomenal Sunday. It felt full. It felt like community at its best.

Advent, however, gives us a different kind of invitation. Not to try and slow the world down, because it won't. Not to pretend life magically eases up at the holidays, because it doesn't. The invitation we receive is for us to take a moment and look at all of the things that fill our lives and ask a simple question:

What am I giving my time to, and does it lead me toward the life God calls me to live?

Time moves at the same pace every second of every minute of every hour of every day of the year. The difference is whether we notice it. Advent helps us to take note. It offers us a natural pause in the middle of all that life heaps on us, so that we can realign, reset, and remember what matters most to us.

This year we will spend the season with a series called Unwrapped: What We Didn't Know We Needed. Each week we will look at one gift hidden in plain sight, a gift you already have, a gift that invites you to live with more purpose and more joy. I want to encourage you to use this month for one simple practice. Find ten minutes each week to look at your calendar and your commitments and ask yourself one honest question:

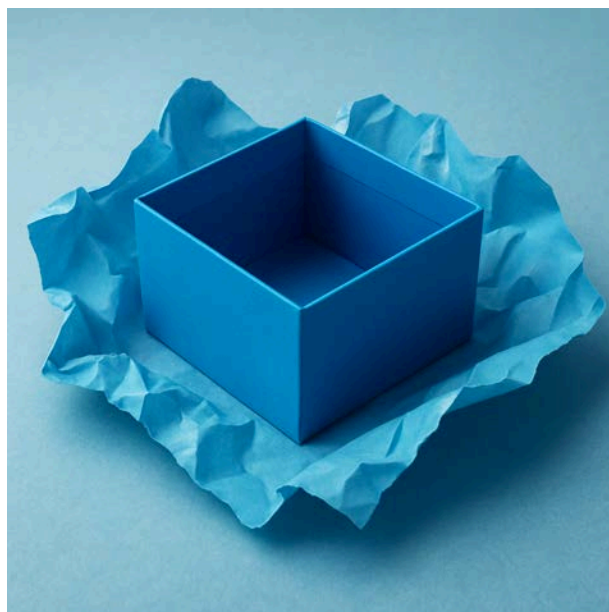
Does this reflect what I say is important in my life?

If the answer is yes, hold on to it. If the answer is no, Advent is the perfect time to shift, to move in a better direction, to recommit to spending your life on the things that matter, to give your attention back to what shapes you toward love, compassion, and hope.

As we begin this season, remember that God meets you in the time you have. Know that small choices can make a big difference, and trust that you are being drawn toward a life shaped by hope.

At the heart of our church's commitment to compassion and justice is **My Life in Pieces**, a powerful ministry that creates space for honest storytelling, deep listening, and meaningful growth. This program tackles some of the most difficult, intimate topics people face—grief, abuse, immigration, family trauma, identity struggles, and more—while offering participants tangible steps toward healing and empowerment.

Each gathering centers on a personal story shared by a member of our community or a guest speaker. These stories are often raw, courageous, and deeply human. But the purpose of My Life in Pieces goes beyond sharing lived experiences. Every session includes actionable takeaways, giving attendees tools they can use in their own lives—whether that means practicing healthier coping strategies, learning how to advocate for themselves or others, or discovering new pathways to support those experiencing similar challenges.

My Life in Pieces is more than a program—it's a reminder that every story matters, and that when we bring our pieces together, we build something stronger, braver, and more whole.

All are welcome to attend, listen, learn, and grow. If you or someone you know could benefit from a supportive space to explore life's toughest topics, we warmly invite you to join us.

Dear Trinity Siblings in Christ,

As we approach the end of 2025, our hearts are filled with gratitude and growing excitement for all that God is doing through Trinity. This year has been marked by growth, connection, and generosity. Together, we have shown what it means to be All In - offering our time, energy, and resources so that others might experience the love and grace of God.

We are writing to you as the pillars of generosity in our congregation. Through your faithful giving and participation, you have sustained the ministries that make Trinity strong and vibrant. BUDGET NARRATIVE: The Details

We are called to share God's love in our community and the world through our mission and ministries. This budget represents how we the people of Trinity seek to do this transformational work.

Discipleship: Facilitates education, programming, and fellowship opportunities for all ages including the applicable supplies and materials. Salaries of the Director of Discipleship, Youth Director, Child Care Coordinator, and two Child Care Providers.

Worship & Music: Supports the creation of blended Sunday service & special worship throughout the year including the annual Festival of Music. Covers audio-visual and live streaming, stipends for guest preachers & musicians, and other music materials. Salaries of the Director of Worship Arts, Children's Choir & Bells Director, and Organist.

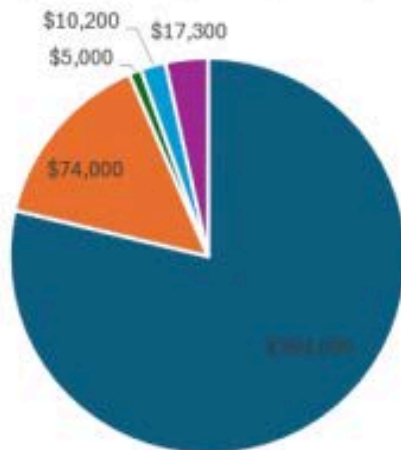
Mission & Outreach: Focuses on supporting community and worldwide partners in works of mercy, justice, and peace. Includes worldwide mission thru Ministry Shares as well as support of HAPI and Cameroon missions. Due to the extensive use of our building and gym in outreach to our neighbors and local partners, 20% of the building facilities budget is included in this category. The Trinity Community Ministries program has its own separate budget but this area includes the parts of that budget Trinity contributes.

Office Services: The communication hub of the church. Includes computer network server, Internet, copiers, mailings, office supplies, accounting software, church management software, and more. Salaries of the Church Administrator and Treasurer. As noted above, 20% of this category is in Outreach.

Building Facilities: Building maintenance and housekeeping to ensure safe and hospitable facilities for all. Includes utilities, property insurance, lawn/snow services, and more. Salary of the Custodian. As noted above, 20% of this category is in Outreach.

Pastoral Support: Pastor's compensation package as the spiritual leader and the administrative officer of the church.

Celebrate the end of your long winter break with us on Friday, January 2 from 4:30pm-8:30pm!

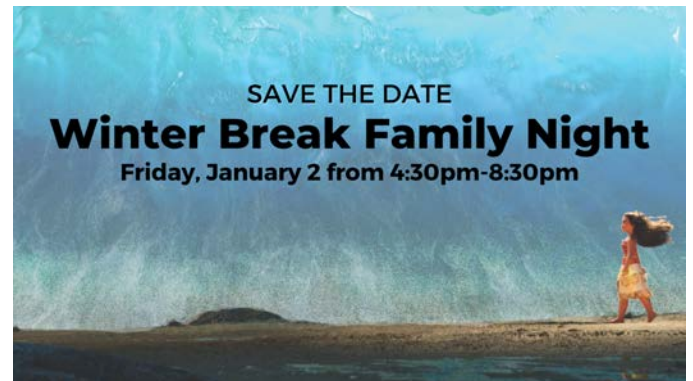

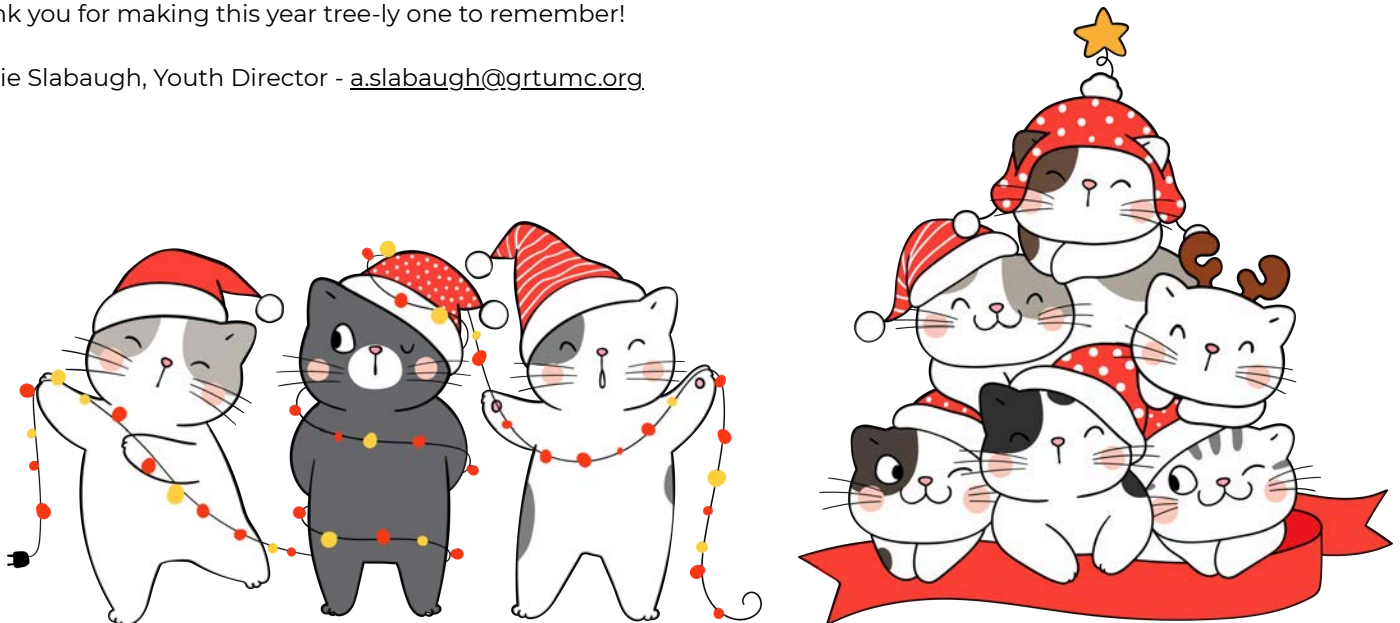
Youth Christmas Party on December 21st

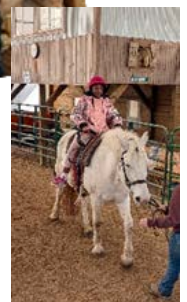
