Behind the Worship: Rituals and Relevance

A new calendar hangs on the wall. A fresh page waits to be filled. The turning of a year slows us down long enough to notice time moving forward. The year has changed, but we are still here.

The writer of Lamentations offers a simple and powerful truth. God's mercy is new every morning. Not new once a year. Not new when we finally get it right. New every morning. Each day begins wrapped in grace before we do a single thing to earn it.

New Year's observances help us remember that truth. They invite us to pause and take stock. Not to judge ourselves. Not to rehearse regrets. But to notice where we have been and where God has already met us along the way.

January is often framed around resolutions. Do better. Try harder. Fix what is broken. While intention has its place, faith offers something deeper. This season invites reimagining instead of self-improvement. Reimagining our lives through the lens of grace. Reimagining our faith as something lived, not perfected.

Reimagining asks different questions. Not, "How do I improve myself?" Instead, "Where has God been faithful?" Not, "What should I change?" Instead, "What is God already doing?" Not, "Who should I become?" Instead, "Who am I becoming as I walk with God?"

The turn of the year is not meant to erase the past. But it does give us space to name it honestly. Joy and grief. Growth and mistakes. Hopes met and dreams deferred. None of it is wasted. None of it disqualifies us. God stays present through it all.

Grace did not expire on December 31. Mercy did not run out overnight. God did not step away when the calendar changed. The same faithfulness that carried us through last year greets us at the start of this one.

January invites us to begin again in a quieter way. Not with pressure. Not with performance. But with truth. It invites us to stand where we are, look at our lives with clarity, and trust that God meets us there. Beginning again does not mean starting over. It means choosing to keep going. It means trusting that grace still holds us. It means believing that God keeps working with real people in real lives.

This is a season to listen more closely. To pay attention to what God is stirring in quiet ways. To notice moments of kindness, courage, and connection. To practice gratitude without ignoring reality. To hold hope without pretending everything is easy.

Faith does not demand dramatic transformation overnight. It asks for daily attention. A willingness to show up. An openness to grace. A trust that God meets us morning by morning.

As this year begins, you are invited to worship. To pray. To wonder. To bring your whole self. The confident parts and the uncertain ones. The hopeful parts and the tired ones.

God's mercy will greet you each morning of this new year. It will meet you in every moment. It will carry us forward together. May you wake up each new day knowing that it is a new day.

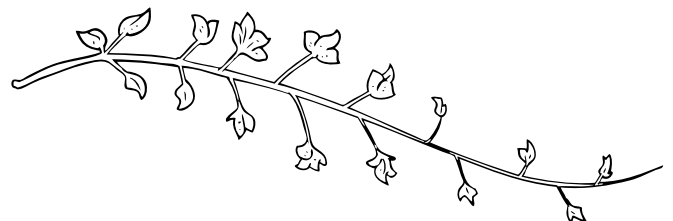

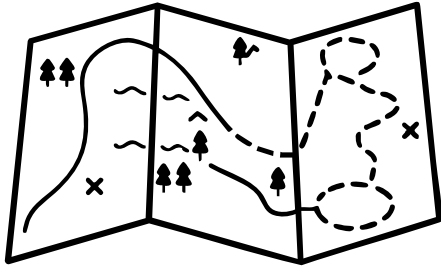

Celebrate the end of your long winter break with us on Friday, January 2 from 4:30pm-8:30pm!

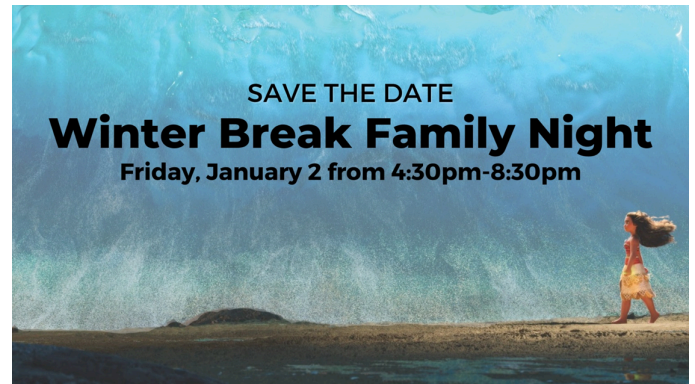

I'm Not Looking Forward to the New Year!

Why look forward when you can look back...is not usually something you will ever hear come out of my mouth. I believe in dreaming and visioning about the future of our programming, how we can be creative and innovative and establishing a vision for how the church can continue to serve the community. But...in this case these last few months, we have been doing amazing things that have helped both serve and build stronger communities. Let's take a look back at what the Community Ministries Program at Trinity UMC has been up to since Oct.

Start of the Community Ministries Program (Oct)

We started the CM Program this year with a waitlist for the first time and the largest number of students started the year that we have had in the last 10 years in both the Kids Club and Transitions Program. Great start to the CM Program Year!



My Life in Pieces – Exploring Grief (Oct)

This intimate discussion around tough topics like grief by people sharing their story gives a rare insight into a struggle and finding hope through the ability to share with others about difficult topics. This talk explored grief through the lens of losing a child and caretaking of a spouse through a journey of cancer. Beautiful and heartbreaking, this program attendees always say how meaningful and impactful the experience is. We will do this program again in the Spring of 2026.

Art in the Parlor – Brad Goff (CM Parent & Faith on the Fly Member) (Sept/Oct)

We took two youth and two Faith on the Fly adult members on a guided Salmon Fishing Trip and absolutely had a blast on the river while catching some nice fish too. Time spent on the river is a great teacher not only fly fishing but about enjoying nature and the reasons why we work so hard in our everyday, busy lives. This was a great experience for all involved.

“A Night to Remember” Community Ministries Program Dinner (Nov)

This is a night of stories, music and food that never disappoints as we hear from community members about how the Community Ministries Program and Trinity UMC are making an impact in the community. “Murphy's Ride” Horse Program at Legacy Stables (Nov)
