Picture This: One Church, One Family, One Photo

Mark your calendars Trinity fam. **Sunday, October 4th**, is World Communion Sunday, an ecumenical celebration of the connectedness of Christians all over the world, across every denomination, language, and culture.

World Communion Sunday began back in the 1930s. It was born out of the desire to show that even in a divided world, the table of Christ is big enough for all of us. So on the first Sunday in October, churches everywhere, from small country chapels to massive cathedrals, share bread and cup on the very same day, a quiet but powerful reminder that we belong to something far bigger than our own little slice of the beloved community

To me, that feels like exactly the right day to capture a snapshot of who we are, right now, as Trinity. So near the end of worship that morning, we're going to pause and take a big, joyful, all-church group photo.

Think about it. Every year we grow a bit and things change subtly. New faces join us, families move on to new adventures, kids grow up right before our eyes, and longtime members keep showing up faithfully, week after week, year after year. This is our chance to freeze this exact moment in our story, this specific gathering of people God has brought together right here, right now.

Years from now, we'll be able to look back at this photo and remember exactly who made up our church family in the fall of 2026.

The photo will go up on our website and we'll use it in future church materials to show off the life and heart of this congregation. We'll also make sure copies are available for anyone who'd like one of their own, a little keepsake of the day and the community you're part of.

Here's the best part. Whether you've been part of Trinity for fifty years or if that is your very first Sunday with us, you're invited to be in the picture. Visitors, longtime members, kids, grandparents, everybody counts, and everybody belongs.

Nobody's required to join in if they'd rather not, but we would absolutely love to see as many smiling faces as possible. The bigger and more colorful this picture is, the better it tells the story of who we are.

Speaking of colorful, here's one small favor to help the photo really shine. Wear a solid colored shirt that day, nothing too busy or heavily patterned, since those tend to get lost in a big group shot. If you're able, lean toward one of the colors of the rainbow, red, orange, yellow, green, blue, or purple. When we all mix together, scattered throughout the crowd, it's going to create a beautiful, vibrant mosaic of color, a fitting visual for a day that celebrates unity made up of wonderful diversity.

So mark it down, spread the word, remind your neighbors, and come ready to smile. On October 4th, let's celebrate our connection to Christians around the whole world and to each other with, one table, one photo, one church.

Outreach & Advocacy

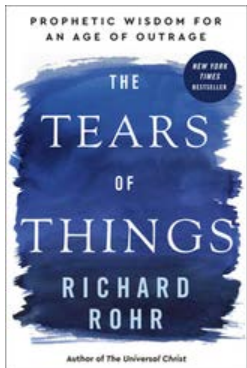

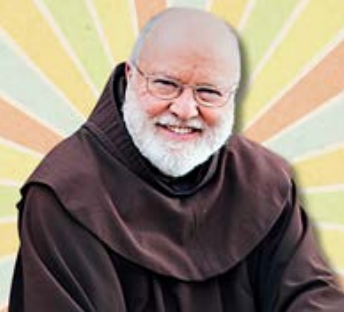

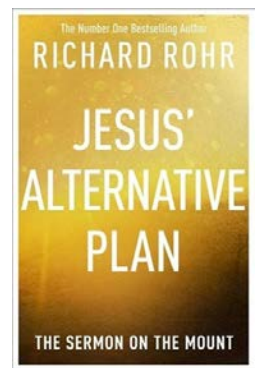

Friends of Rohr at Trinity





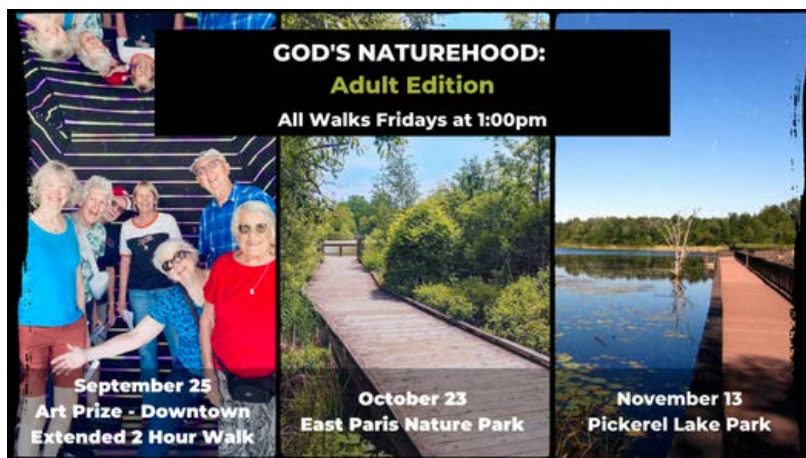

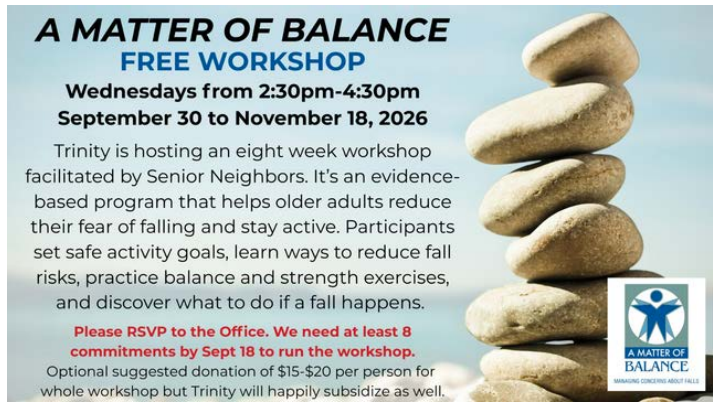

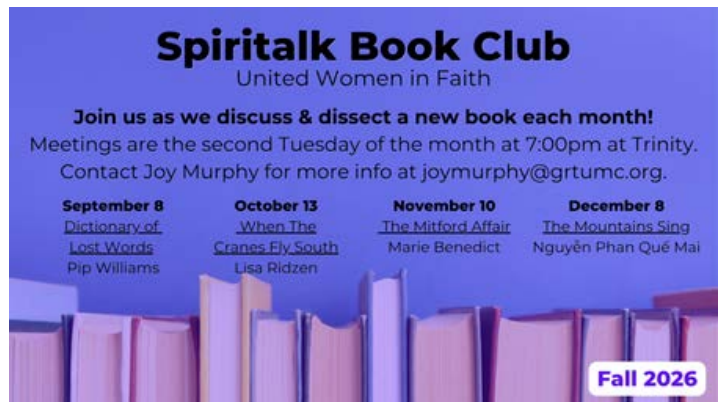


A MATTER OF BALANCE

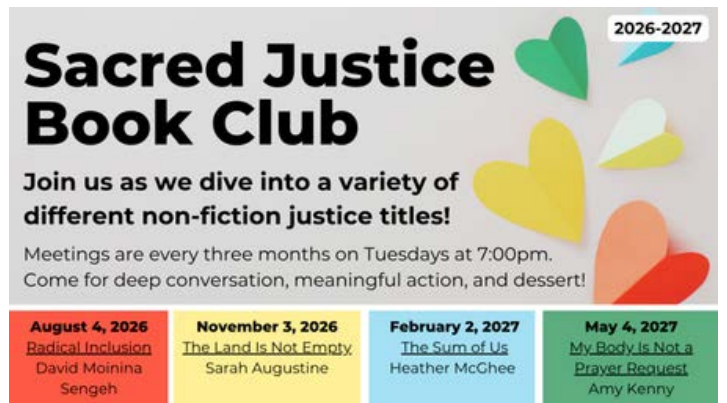

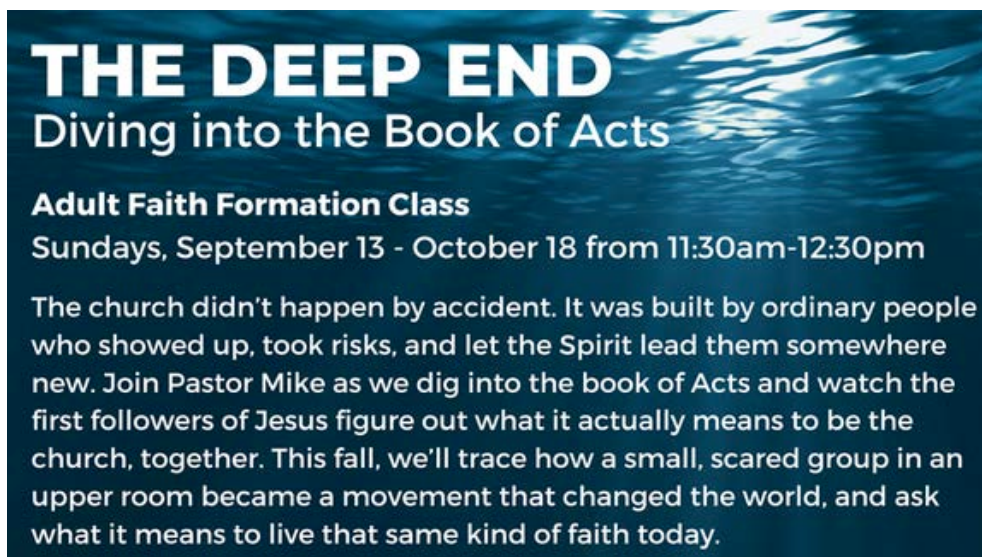

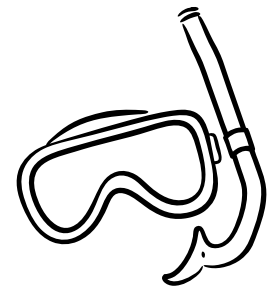

A big part of our job is ensuring the safety of all of our children and we can only do that if we know who is here and what their needs are!

Many things are the same as last year, but keep an eye out for new events & opportunities! We cannot wait to connect with you. This fall and throughout the program year... let's show up! Let's show up for ourselves, for each other, and for the world.

One new thing we want to continue sharing information about here as well as all the other places above...

This year we're adjusting the Sunday morning faith formation line-up slightly for our middle & high school youth as well as adjusting our Youth Choir & Bells rehearsal times which effects kids & youth of all ages.



TIME CHANGE: Youth Group

Our time of fellowship & faith formation for 6th to 12th grade youth is moving out of the Faith Formation Hour at 11:30am and into the Worship Hour (10:15am-11:15am). Like with the younger kids, youth will now have the choice to go upstairs for Youth Group after the children's moment. Youth Group will meet the 2nd to 5th Sundays of each month. Special during worship opportunities may be available for youth on select 1st Sundays.

Our hope is this will increase youth engagement in Youth Group & worship and make it easier for families to show up in as many ways as possible. Staff and Leadership Teams want to trial this schedule this year and then we will revisit the schedule for future years based on feedback from youth & families, attendance figures, etc.

... but Laura, my whole family typically sticks around for Faith Formation Hour. What will the Youth do during that time if Youth Group takes place during Worship? An excellent question! Youth will have several options...

#1. Kinship Quest

Trinity Kids (PreK-5th Grade) is evolving into Kinship Quest! This new offering will be an opportunity for any interested kids & youth (PreK-12th Grade) to gather with Ms. Laura and/or Ms. Annie & other volunteers for a time of fun & fellowship with the goal of finding commonality & building relationships. We will crank up the volume & the activity level. Get ready for gym time, game time, special snacks, & more! We are excited to have youth join in – gym & game room activities are more fun with more folks after all! Kinship Quest will also occasionally include service & justice opportunities for kids, youth, & families.



#2. New Date & Time: Youth Choir & Bells

This update is NEW even since the last newsletter. Trinity's Youth Choir & Handbells are moving rehearsals to Sunday mornings from 11:30am-12:00pm. Interested PreK-12th Grade kiddos will have the option to attend either choir or bells each week (the two will alternate weeks) during the Faith Formation Hour before ending their time by joining Kinship Quest in progress. Our hope is this will be a great opportunity for more of our kiddos & youth to participate in this amazing music ministry while also ensuring they still get time from 12:00pm-12:30pm to get their big energy out. More details on the logistics of this time period will be coming via email before September 13 from Laura and/or Ms. Andrea, Youth Choir Director.

#3. Volunteer: Kinship Quest

Any youth ages 14-17 who want to stick around for Kinship Quest (the whole hour or just the post-music portion) but who would prefer to do so in a "helper" capacity may have their grown-up contact Ms. Laura. There will be opportunities for them to assist with leading games & activities for which they can collect volunteer hours for school, scouts, or other extracurriculars.

#4. Volunteer: Nursery

Any youth ages 14-17 may also volunteer to be a "helper" in the Nursery during the Faith Formation Hour (11:30am-12:30pm). Specific guidelines for how volunteering in the Nursery works will be shared soon. Only one youth will be able to sign-up each week and there will be very specific rules about arrival/departure times and what activities helpers can assist with to ensure the comfort & safety of our littlest Trinity friends. On weeks they sign up to assist in the Nursery, youth would not have the option to do Youth Choirs as coming/going from the Nursery space is disruptive to our little friends.

#5. Unsupervised Time

As always, unlike with our younger kiddos, youth can also make a choice not to participate in any of these during Faith Formation Hour opportunities and to instead fellowship in the Parlor or another part of the building. Staff reminds youth grown-ups that during these times your youth are not supervised by Trinity Staff or Protection Policy Certified Volunteers. Their safety is your responsibility and we highly recommend you check-in with them to ensure they're keeping doors open, not being alone with other youth or adults, etc.

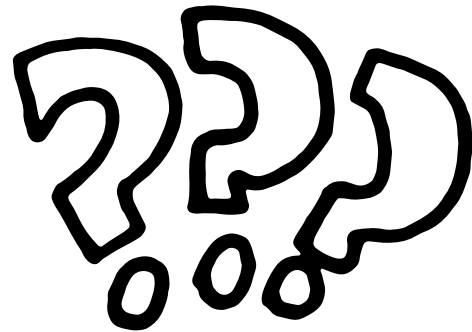

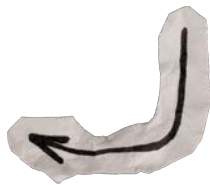
Community Ministries
